What is the STEM Ambassadors Programme?

The STEM Ambassadors Programme is a free of charge resource for teachers, schools and colleges across the UK, offering you support from thousands of people with STEM backgrounds to help you excite and inspire your students in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.

The STEM Ambassadors Programme is funded by the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS), and co-ordinated by STEMNET.

STEMNET works with a range of partners to manage STEM Ambassadors locally – these are organisations skilled in facilitating business-education links. They will help you determine how you can most benefit from involvement with an Ambassador and then find someone who fits your requirements.



The benefits to you

Each volunteer Ambassador is registered, trained and checked with the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) or the Protecting Vulnerable Groups (PVG) Scheme in Scotland. They can help you in a variety of ways – within the curriculum and beyond.

It's up to you how you think you can best use their enthusiasm and expertise.

Types of activities include:

- Assisting with STEM clubs – either within school hours or as part of extended school.
- Helping add a work-related perspective to curriculum topics, like energy, health and sustainability.
- Providing insights into career opportunities arising from STEM qualifications – both traditional and less traditional STEM-related careers.
- Facilitating workplace visits where appropriate and helping students get the best from them.
- Assisting with various activities, both within the timetable and outside it.
- Working as mentors to students, helping to encourage them and develop their motivation and employability skills.

Who are STEM Ambassadors?

Ambassadors come from an extremely diverse range of backgrounds and working environments. What they all have in common is that they use STEM skills in their everyday lives and have a desire to help more young people understand how Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths can help them achieve their potential.

Our current Ambassadors include:

Healthcare scientists, physicists, environmental scientists, engineers of all disciplines, statisticians, architects, financial modellers, apprentices, industrial chemists, microbiologists, zoologists, designers, geologists, electronics specialists, set designers and countless others...
